55-Alive Mature Driving offered July 11, 12

AARP's 55-Alive Mature Driving, the popular driving update and refresher for men and women over age 50, will be offered at St. Peter's Community Hospital on Thursday and Friday, July 11 and 12.
 At around age 50 almost everyone begins to experience marked physical changes that effect the way they drive. 55-Alive is a classroom driving course that addresses those changes with such topics as how to recognize and overcome the effects on driving skills, reviewing basic rules of the road and preventing accidents, with emphasis on continued driving. There are no tests and no driving to do.
 Montana law provides that auto insurance companies must give a discount on premiums to those 55 and older completing the course.
 Class is from noon to 4 p.m. each day. Cost is \$8. Classes are sponsored by St. Peter's Community Hospital's 60-Plus program. Instructors are AARP volunteers.
 Pre-registration is recommended, participants are encouraged to sign up early. To register, call St. Peter's 60-Plus Connection, 447-2547. Leave your name, course name, date you prefer and phone number on the recorder, this registers you.

Appleton left Montana in 1896, worked in Denver and Cripple Creek, Colorado for two years, then traveled on to Spokane, Washington for the next four years. He returned to the East Coast to re-establish business relations with his old partner Franklin R. Wallace for the purpose of developing a suburb in Flushing, New York, called "Waldheim." Interestingly, this little early 20th century enclave of single-family houses remains largely intact amid the highly urbanized environs of Flushing today. Appleton retired to Wading River, New York where he gardened, kept bees and built a number of houses, one of which he occupied until his death in 1941.

THE ARCHITECTURAL PROFESSION of the late 19th century encompassed a confusing array of talents and skills. With few colleges offering architectural degrees, the vast majority of those working in the field gained their credentials as George Appleton did — through apprenticeship in the building trades and a healthy measure of hutzpah. Not until 1917 did the State of Montana issue architectural licenses. Prior to that, caveat emptor — buyer beware! The publication of standardized plans, such as those of the R.W. Shoppell Co., brought both coherency and consistency to the work of local builders. The client could be assured of a certain structural soundness and stylistic sophistication.

Energetic young men such as George Appleton made possible the urban transformation of Helena during the late 1880s. Appleton took full advantage of the national industrial markets for the design, construction and financing of his speculative ventures. While these national links brought certain benefits for some Heleneans, the erratic nature of rampant speculation provoked considerable pain for the community, especially when the bottom fell out of the real estate market, again, as a result of national financial maneuvers. Caught with more housing starts than he would ever finish in Helena, Appleton moved on to follow the flow of investment capital in this new economy.

Although a great many residences in Helena may be attributed to George S. Appleton based upon distinctive design characteristics, the following list includes only those properties for which documented links to Appleton and/or the Wallace & Thornburgh firm exist.
