roads, and guests to the ranch were commonly chauffeured from Helena in Child's private railroad cars.

UNLIKE MANY OF HELENA'S capitalists, William C. Child did not go on to assume greater fame and glory in the annals of Montana's past. The founder of White Face Farm was instead bankrupted by the Silver Panic of 1893 and was forced to give up his ranch to one of his creditors, Wilbur Fisk Sanders of Helena, during the summer of that year.

During the months that followed the loss of all of his fortunes and his beloved East Helena ranch, Child became increasingly distraught, attempting suicide with such "poisons" as morphine and laudanum (an opium derivative) that he had stolen from the office of his physician during the fall of 1893. On October 14, he died under mysterious circumstances at White Face Farm, but "nervous prostration" was listed as the cause of his death.

A number of different families lived at the ranch between 1893 and 1943. Between those years, the ranch was operated primarily as a dairy farm, but during the Great Depression a handful of renters neglected the ranch and its buildings.

When current owner Paul Kleffner leased White Face Farm with an option to buy in 1943, many of the original windows in the home and barn were broken, deteriorating roofs were caving in, fences were falling down, tons of manure made standing upright in the barn impossible, and a chicken coop marred the beautiful maple hardwood dance floor in the second-story ballroom of the house.

IT'S HARD TO IMAGINE the Child-Kleffner Ranch of 1943, from its appearance today. After years of careful renovation and maintenance, the property has been restored to a model nineteenth-century farm, complete with the original dinner bell that is located on the north side of the house. Although parts of the interior of the farmhouse have been modernized, White Face Farm is in relatively original condition and was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975.

And the best part of the Child-Kleffner Ranch story? The ranch is open to the public. Owner and historian Paul Kleffner, who has worked the property for over fifty years, has thoroughly researched William C. Child and the ranch and is well-versed in the history of White Face Farm.

Kleffner offers guided tours of White Face Farm, and private gatherings are also available, both by appointment.

They will be joined by historic clothier Connie Lindmier, who will discuss and display women's clothing of the ranching frontier at 2 and 4:30 Saturday and 1 and 3:30 Sunday. Great Falls author Gayle Shirley will give presentations on cowboy artist Charles Russell at 11:30 and 2:30 Saturday, followed by signings of her book, "Charlie's Trail."

Meanwhile, the lower ranch yard will be the stage for the Double-D Drifters. Duane Dickinson and Dick Dillof will perform a vast selection of songs played on the high plains from the mid-1800s to the 1920s.

The Double-D Drifters will perform each day from 1 to 4. The lower yard will also be the scene for other activities, including children's games, an operating 1880s chuckwagon, rope-making, wheelwrighting and blacksmithing demonstrations. Branding of ranch calves will be from 10:30 to 1 on Saturday, while hayrides drawn by the ranch's Belgian draft horses will be from 11:30 to 2 each day.


Horsehair hitching with master hitcher Lennie Spurlock will be featured along Bunkhouse Row. The historic ranch house will be open for walkthroughs of the parlor and sitting/dining rooms.
